On 21st August 06 Legal Literacy Workshop was conducted at "Gosavi Vasti" in Hadapsar. This is the first workshop conducted by our Club in collaboration with the ILS Law College, Pune. Two more workshops are planned to be conducted for the same women and young girls to ensure that they absorb the legal aspects explained to them fully and the entire *basti* becomes aware on 14th Sept and 24th Sept 06.

On other issues/matters of law, students gave information to the people through street plays on topics like Child Marriage Restraint Act , Dowry Prohibition Act, Child Labour, Importance of education for girls, Domestic Violence and the Law. It was followed by detailed explanation by the professors namely, Dr.Sita Bhatia and Prof.Waghmare.The workshop was attended by 60 women and young girls approximately. The best part was that all the legal aspects were explained to them in the type of language which they would comprehend easily. President Rajendra was present during this programme and he really appreciated the entire approach.

On 25th August 06 Legal Aid Centre will be inaugurated at the Market Yard Deep Graha's office. This Legal Aid Centre will work every 4th Saturday of the month hearing and dealing with the legal cases/disputes that may come to it. The timing will be from 2 pm to 4pm. It will be attended by at least one professor and few students. Besides, other legal literacy camps/workshops are being planned. The Four-Way Test

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The Four-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy.

This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways. It asks the following four questions:

"Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"

Q. TELL ME, WHICH WERE THE FIRST ANIMALS TO FLY?

A. Insects have been able to fly for far longer than any other animal. Winged insects probably developed from types of worms which lived in the sea. Some insects were huge, like the giant dragonfly meganeura, which lived about 300 million years ago. Its wingspan was more than 60 centimetres.

Q. TELL ME, HOW CAN A CHAMELEON LOOK IN TWO PLACES AT ONCE?

A. A Chameleon can swivel its eyes separately. One may be looking forwards, and the other backwards. The eyes can also work together to focus on the same object.

Q. TELL ME, WHAT IS THE LARGEST ANIMAL IN THE WORLD?

A. The blue whale is the largest animal that has ever lived on this planet. It can grow to 27 metres long, and weigh 190 tonnes.

Q. TELL ME, WHAT IS THE SMALLEST LAND MAMMAL?

A. The pygmy white-toothed shrew is the smallest mammal which lives on land. It measures only 3.5 cm and weighs about 2 grams. Pygmy shrews live in Africa, and eat spiders, grasshoppers and cockroaches- Which may be almost as big as they are.

HOW TO RECRUIT THE RIGHT PERSON FOR THE JOB?

Put about 100 bricks in some particular order in a closed room with an open window. Then send 2 or 3 candidates in the room and close the door.

Leave them alone and come back after 6 hours and then analyze the situation.

If they are counting the bricks. - Put them in the accounts department.
